

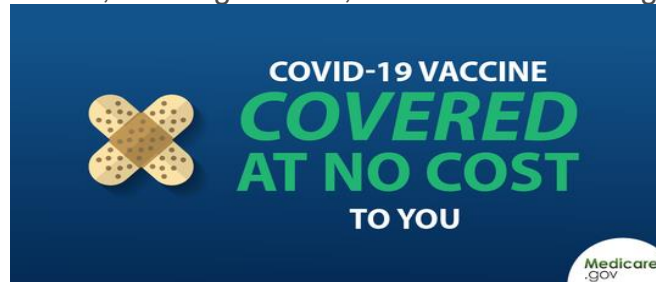

## Information about the COVID-19 vaccine

COVID-19 vaccines are becoming more available for people over 65. Each state has its own plan for deciding who they'll vaccinate first, and how residents can get vaccines. **Medicare Part B covers the COVID-19 vaccine**, so there's no cost to you. When you go to get your vaccine, make sure to bring your Medicare card, so the vaccine provider can bill Medicare. Remember: Stopping the COVID-19 pandemic is going to take all the tools in our toolbox. Along with getting vaccinated, it's important to keep washing your hands, wearing a mask, and social distancing.
